**Student immunization against common childhood diseases**

In recent years, some parents have decided not to immunize their children. As a consequence, when you are working in a school you may be at risk of catching one of a number of common childhood diseases. Some may carry a higher risk for adults, for example it is possible that contracting mumps in adulthood may lead to impaired hearing.

You are strongly advised to check whether you have been immunized against the common childhood diseases listed below, and, if you have not or if you need a booster, we recommend that you arrange this for your own safety before doing any school visits for this module.
